# Creating and Formatting e-Books for Writers E-book Fundamentals Handout #4

# 1. Beginning

To convert a manuscript to an e-book format, it's important to begin with a clean Word document. Documents from other word processors will work, but will require more tinkering down the road. Most word processors have a feature to export to Word. Use a DOC file rather than a DOCX file.

# 2. Cleaning Up

Remove graphics, sidebars, footnotes, page numbers, and pull quotes. These items don't work well when using an e-reader.

- Save graphics in a separate folder to re-insert later in the process.
- Copy footnotes to a page at the end of the chapter or at the end of the book.
- Sidebar information can be incorporated within the text or included as an appendix.
- Pull quotes are design elements not needed in an e-book.
- Users of e-readers determine the size of the font on the page. This can throw page numbers, as well as footnotes, into odd places on the page.
- 3. Remove the front and back cover image, if they are included in the document being converted.
