An Emergency Kit

- Make a kit for each family member (72 hours). Considering the age of person, make the kits portable. A five-year-old may not be able to carry three gallons of water, so an adult will need to help with such supplies.

- Think about special needs such as prescription medications, diapers, etc.
- Three gallons of water per person
- Non-perishable food for three days
- Battery operated radio with NOAA weather alerts
- Flash light and batteries
- Small first-aid kit
- Whistle, to signal if separated
- Paper maps
- Chargers for electronic devices, such as cell phones and tablets.
- A list of more emergency supplies
